Section 69.16A of the Iowa Code requires gender balance on those City Boards and Commissions required or governed by state law unless the City has made a good faith effort for a period of three months to appoint a qualified person. This affects and includes: Airport Board of Trustees; Civil Service Commission; Human Rights Commission; Library Board of Trustees; and Planning and Zoning Commission.
