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

WHAT ARE HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS MATERIALS?

Household hazardous materials (HHMs) are products found around the home that are considered flammable, toxic, corrosive or reactive. They can contaminate the air, soil, wastewater treatment systems and drinking water supplies if mismanaged or disposed of improperly. These materials can also be a health risk to family members, pets and wildlife if handled improperly. Paint, auto products, solvents, cleaners, and pesticides, are all considered to be household hazardous materials. These may be disposed of free of charge at the Household Hazardous Materials Collection Center located at 5800 28th Street in Sioux City. Appointments must be made in advance by calling 712-255-8345.

WHAT ITEMS CAN BE RECYCLED?



PLASTICS

If the plastic is moldable or holds a shape it can be put into your recycle container. Examples include milk jugs, soda bottles, shampoo and detergent bottles, cleaning bottles and dairy product containers. Containers that have automotive products in them will not be accepted. Please redeem plastic bottles if possible.



CARDBOARD

Acceptable cardboard includes all corrugated cardboard, food boxes, pizza boxes, and cardboard egg cartons. Remove all Styrofoam, plastic liners, inserts, and wrappings from cardboard boxes. Cardboard needs to be broken down and flattened.



PAPER PRODUCTS

Acceptable items include office paper and envelopes, compute paper, brown paper sacks, newspaper (including slick ads), junk mail, telephone books, magazines, catalogs, pizza boxes and hard and soft cover books.



GLASS BOTTLES & JARS

Glass bottles and jars are recyclable curbside. Please redeem glass if possible.



ALUMINUM & TIN FOOD CANS

Fruit and vegetable cans, pet food tins, beverage cans, coffee cans, empty aerosol cans, metal lids from glass jars and bottles.

Recycling is collected on the same day as normal trash collection for no additional charge! Request your Free Recycling Container by calling 712-279-0151.







THE MODERN LANDSCAPE AND INCREASED RUNOFF

Urban landscapes are dominated by impervious surfaces such as roadways, parking lots and rooftops. Urban green spaces often feature turf grass with short roots over compacted soils. Such impervious and compacted surfaces decrease the amount of storm water that can infiltrate into the soil, resulting in higher volumes of storm water runoff. Storm water carries pollutants into storm drains, which discharge directly into local streams and lakes. Urban runoff occurs with almost every rainfall, causing water quality problems, flashy flows that erode stream corridors, and increased flood potential.

STORM WATER POLLUTANTS

- Trash such as cigarette butts, paper wrappers, & plastic bottles
- Oil & grease from car leaks, gas stations & industrial areas
- Thermal impacts from sun-headed impervious surfaces
- Pesticides & nutrients from lawns, parks, & roadsides
- Salt & sand from snow & Ice control applications
- Illicit connections to storm sewers
- Sediment from construction sites
- Illegally dumped pollutants
- Bacteria from pet waste

WAYS TO PREVENT STORM WATER POLLUTION

- Take your vehicle to a carwash or wash in the grass
- Never mow or sweep grass clippings onto street
- Check car for leaks and recycle your motor oil
- Direct downspouts away from paved surfaces
- Never dump anything down a storm drain
- Use lawn chemicals sparingly
- Don't hose down driveways
- Plant native plants



REFUND POLICY

REFUND POLICY

The City of Sioux City Parks and Recreation provides recreational and aquatic opportunities. Our facilities are available for the rental needs of families, schools, companies, groups and organizations year round.

In order to effectively and fairly serve our patrons, we have implemented the following refund policy:

PARK FACILITY RENTALS: Must be paid at the time of the reservation placement. A full refund will be given to shelters, Rose Garden, Anderson Dance Pavilion, and Grandview Bandshell rentals with a thirty day notification of cancellation.

SWIMMING POOL RENTALS: Renters will have the option to rebook or obtain a refund if a weather related circumstance arises. No refunds will be given for pool daily admission fees if the pool is closed due to inclement weather or due to pool issues not governed by City staff.

LONG LINES FAMILY REC CENTER: Refunds will be given to facility rentals that are canceled thirty days prior to the event. For larger event rentals (i.e. large weddings/receptions, Quinceaneras, company and community events) that paid the \$100 non-refundable down payment and/or the full or partial balance – a refund excluding the \$100 non-refundable down payment will be given with a thirty day notification of cancellation.

PROGRAM REFUNDS: Recreation programming requires a minimum of one week cancellation prior to the start of the class for a refund (less a 10% administrative fee). No refunds will be given once the class has begun.

ATHLETIC PROGRAMS: Youth and adult athletic program cancellations will be refunded (less a 10% administrative fee) **if the cancellation is received prior to the deadline dates.** No refund will be given after the deadline date nor after the sport has begun.

We strive to follow these stated policies but understand circumstances may prohibit the ability of the citizen to engage in the program or rental agreements. Please call with any questions about unexpected situations that arise and require your cancellations. Proof of situation may be required to obtain a refund.



TRAIL SYSTEMS

Sioux City is proud of the trail system it has developed. The Sioux City Trail System provides citizens and visitors the opportunity to explore our unique landscape along the Riverfront Trail, enjoy a healthy urban experience along the Perry Creek Trail, and benefit from the natural habitat of the Bacon Creek Trail. Sioux City offers over 24 miles of paved recreational trails suitable for walking, jogging, biking, inline-skating, and skateboarding.

TRAIL CONNECTIVITY

Sioux City's Trail vision began as a way to connect our community assets, i.e. parks, landmarks, and destination places. This vision remains the Trails central focus.

TRAIL CONNECTIONS

The Perry Creek Trail system has improved the access along the creek with a concrete trail, lighting, benches, signage, landscaping, and bridges. The Perry Creek Trail runs from 2nd and Jackson Streets to Stone Park Blvd. for approximately 3 1/4 miles. Citizens and visitors are able to jog, bike, walk, or roller-blade along the corridor and connect to the Riverfront Trail in Chris Larsen Park. The Riverfront Trail routes between Floyd Blvd. South Bottoms Memorial Circle to Riverside Park for a total of 5.35 miles one way. The Riverfront Trail also connects at the South Bottoms Memorial Circle to the Floyd Trail which follows the bank of the Floyd River out to 28th Street for approximate 3 miles one way. The 3.0 mile Bacon Creek Trail encircles Bacon Creek Lake and offers a natural environment for trail users. The Chautauqua Trail, along Singing Hills Blvd. in the Morningside area, traverses to the west through the Industrial Interchange and continues through Chautauqua Park for a one way distance of 4.7 miles. Each trail offers an exceptional way to enjoy our City.


